

Meet the NW Western Swing Music Society's President for 2012 Butch Gibson

I was recently asked the question, "How did you and Western Swing meet?" Considering all the folks in the Western Swing Society who were performing on stage with their families by the time they could crawl up to a mic, my story is going to sound a bit less dramatic. Simply put, I just always loved music!

Although, I didn't learn to play an instrument with a group until rather late in life . . . 35, it was worth the wait! After all that hesitation, my first job was a dream come true - I played with Hoot Gibson (*my father*) as part of his band, *Pardners*. Dad had said, "Son, all you needed to do was ask." But that was dad's guitar and I never even considered touching it. It was a brand new 1963 Fender Stratocaster.

Just before I picked up the bass guitar, a new club was forming, the Seattle Western Swing Society (SWSS). One of their first venues was the Sherwood Hotel in Tacoma. It was there that I first met Paul Anastasio and Bill Garner. Although I didn't play music, the SWSS was using Tommy Pries as their sound man since he had the best sound system at the time. I was his tech and assistant. It was a few years later that they moved north to the Everett Eagles. There I met Dana Wills. She gave me (and I still have) a signed copy of her then latest release, **Bob's Sister Helen's Kid**. I told Dana at that time my goal was to get good enough to back someone of her caliber. I hope I have done that.

Time passes and I continue to play music and try to learn. My current venture is the fiddle; and, with the aid of one of the fiddle players in my band, Jeanne Yearian, it's coming along quicker than I thought it would.

Then, in 2009, Lloyd Hooper nominated me to the Board and I was elected. In 2011, I accepted the position of Vice-President in the Society. Now here I am: President of


