We're so excited to be part of the King County Fair this year, helping them helping us to begin again. We are sponsoring the Northwest Western Heritage stage. It will cover traditional musical styles taken from several of the various groups who brought their cultural traditions to the Northwest. As a special treat, we have added **Cowboy Poetry** and a bit of **western music** to the program!

Join **cowboy poet Lynn Kopelke** for free workshops on the basics of writing and performing cowboy poetry and prose on Thursday and Friday. Want to give it a try? Then enter a **Tall Tale competition** for a cash prize. Interested? Sign up with Lynn at the fair. The yarn spinning will commence at high noon on Saturday.

What better way to start each day than with western swing music! Beginning Thursday, **Butch Gibson and Pardners with guest musician Mike Schweedler on the steel guitar** will be hosting the opening jam session, from 10 to 11:30! After a short warm up for the band, jammers will be invited to the stage. Sign up to join in.

We will have a spot set up with a 20x12 covered by a 20x20 canopy. There will be space for the dancers in front of the stage (still under the canopy) but it will be grass. We will also have bleachers for seating (hopefully covered with a canopy) but you are welcome to bring your own chairs along. The stage will be placed next to the Covered Arena on the east side of the fairgrounds and the restroom is just down the

paved walkway a short distance. Our stage will be open from 10 am - 6 pm, Thursday, July 15 through Sunday, July 18.

In observance of the State-wide quarantine, the NWWSMS Board did not meet during the months of April through June 2021; however, corresponding through email it was decided:




- guitarist, Mike Schweedler. Various NW groups, including cowboy poets, will entertain daily until 6 PM.



In 1961 I was a Country DJ on KCKC in San Bernardino. Tenn. Ernie worked there as a DJ long before I did. But I loved this song then, and now in modern stereo, it's even better. This is the original, remastered, and not the overdubbed version. This is her first #1, and it remained on the charts for most of 1961. Walkin' After Midnight was a bigger hit, It only made it #2.

Joe Baker 1952-2021

Joe Baker was born October 7, 1952, Mineral Wells. Texas. He was raised on a Black Angus cattle ranch near Flower Mound, Texas. Joe was drafted into the Army in 1972 and remained there until While in the Army, he worked as a music

promoter.

Joe and his love for Western Swing and Cowboy music started at an early age and continued throughout his life. He began his radio career in his hometown of Mineral Wells, but it is from the State of New Mexico that he became world-famous for his work. He was a great promoter of Western Swing and Western Music Artists and he worked hard for many years to preserve the rich heritage of this genre of music.

Joe had been in ill health for several years and was in hospice care for the week before his passing. Here is a partial list of his honors and awards.

SO WHAT DOES THE PEDAL STEEL GUITAR HAVE TO DO WITH JAZZ?

'Steelin' Crazy Rhythm'

Genre: Western Swing and Jazz

So what does the pedal steel guitar have to do with jazz? Plenty...

While the steel guitar had its start in Hawaiian music, it was eventually picked up by the early western swing bands of the 1930s and 40s. That music took big band arrangements and replaced the horns and reeds with exciting arrangements on stringed instruments. The swinging

harmonies played by steel and electric guitars and electric mandolin were a hallmark sound of the genre.

Langley, BC musician Tom Hammel has combined his love of the pedal steel guitar and western swing and jazz music to create this 12-song album. It consists of mostly instrumental covers and one new song, "Out of Odessa", written especially for the album. Hammel has been playing, writing, and recording music for decades with local Vancouver roots bands, and currently plays with alt-country band *DerbyTown*.

Vancouver guitarist Paul Pigat lends his guitar mastery to the album on five tracks along with upright bassist Jeremy Holmes and drummer James Badger. Toronto jazz singer Alex Pangman, Canada's Sweetheart of Swing contributes her expressive and playful vocal styling to the song *It's All Your Fault*.

With the rise of COVID-19 and a pause in the live music scene, Hammel thought this would be a great time to collaborate with some of Canada's finest jazz and swing musicians. This created some technical challenges as the musicians could not just all show up at one small studio to record. With some diligence and learning on everyone's part, the remote recording hurdles were cleared successfully to create this music.



The performances are superb. Paul [Paul Pigat, guitar] is, of course, his usual brilliant self on the tracks he plays on; as your steel playing matches those high standards, the results are pretty damn exciting! I also really dig the accordion added to some numbers, particularly on Si Tu Vois Ma Mere, answering the steel lines, and on What Is This Thing Called Love, with its extended 3-way riff near the end. You've found new things to contribute to some old favourites of mine, such as Steelin' Home, and Mission To Moscow; and Cherry proves an excellent choice for a new adaptation. But even more impressive, I think, are the ballads: delicate, forceful, and emotional, all at the same time. your "feel" for these tunes is outstanding, and a bit of an eye-opener. The more I listen, the more good things I hear: a great set of recordings, with not a single second-rate tune in the bunch.

The Brazos Valley Boys under the direction of Morey Sullivan have just recorded a wonderful new CD of 12 cuts with the spotlight on many of their fine musicians and guest vocalists.



Morev is heard on lead vocal and bass.

Rob Loren plays fiddle, Mike Moore- trumpet and flugelhorn, Joe Settlemires- lead and rhythm guitar, Gary Sullivan- drums/percussion and backup vocals and JD Walters is playing steel guitar. Asleep at the Wheel icon, Ray Benson joins Morey on vocal duet on the pop standard, *That's Life. Rex Allen Jr.* joins Morey on vocal duet on a medley of Chet Atkins and Boudleaux Bryant's *Midnight* and Bob Wills and Tommy Duncan's *Brain Cloudy Blues.* Elizabeth Sullivan joins Morey for a duet on Leon Russell's *This Masquerade.* Other musicians heard on various cuts are Frankie Kaye- lap steel, Harry Miller- keyboard, Jim Piller- drums, Adrian Rees- lead and rhythm guitar, Bruce Roberts- Drums, Bob Walzel-saxophone and clarinet and Josh Ward- rhythm guitar.

The album opens from the Bob Wills library with *Blues for Dixie* and the pop big bands are remembered with Duke Ellington's *Do Nothing Till You Hear from Me*. There is also a nice medley of *How High the Moon* and Charlie Parker's *Ornithology*. Other pop, blues and jazz favorites revisited are *Blues O'Mighty*, *In the Wee Small Hours of the Morning*, *Relaxin'*, Peggy Lee's *I Love Being Here With You and Ray* Charles' *Hallelujah I Love Her So*. A true gem is Cindy Walker's *You Don't Know Me*, from Eddy Arnold, Jerry Vale and so many others.


