Durwood Strube

Durwood Strube, of Proctor, went home to his Lord and Savior Thursday, March 31, 2016, at the age of 78.

He was born September 7, 1937, in Dublin, Texas, to N.H. "Bill" Strube and Winnie Margaret Gray Strube. He married Donna Joan Neal December 23, 1955, in Proctor.

Durwood lived in the Proctor community for over 53 years. He was employed as a sewing machine mechanic for Sidran Manufacturing in Brownwood for over 45 years and as a musician as well. He was a member of Hope Masonic Lodge of Comanche, York Rite Lodge of Brownwood, and a past member of the Scottish Rite. He was a member of the Cowboy Church of Erath County for many years.

Durwood was a charter member of the Cowtown Society of Western Music and received the President's Choice Award in 2004. He was inducted into the Texas Western Swing Hall of Fame in 2011, the Western Swing Music Society of the Southwest in 2013, and the NorthWest Western Swing Music Society in 2014.

Durwood was active with various cutting horse associations and loved trail riding. He enjoyed playing western swing music, riding cutting horses and playing fast pitch softball. Durwood loved spending time with his family and many friends. He will be missed by all who knew him.

5/6/1931 - 2/24/2016 Jay Riley, 84, of West Sacramento went to be with our Lord on February 24, 2016. He was a loving husband to Jetta for over 61 years. He was born in Texarkana, TX, during the depression. Jay became an Eagle Scout in his boyhood and learned to play the guitar at 16. It wasn't until 1950 he began playing steel guitar. He was part of many popular bands in the area that traveled the Ark-La-Tex area in the 40's and 50's.

1954 was a memorable year for Jay. He got to work with Elvis Presley and married his one-and-only Jetta Rae Smith. In 1955 Jay moved to California, where he continued playing for several different bands. He also worked in the Heavy Duty Truck Parts industry as a salesman in the Sacramento Valley for 58 years.

He was a steel guitar musician for 65 years who played on the Louisiana Hayride, and was the first inductee of the Western Swing Society in Sacramento in 1982. Jay was inducted into the NorthWest Western Swing Music Society in 2001. He will be greatly missed by family and friends.




DVD: Bakersfield Sound Artist: Billy Mize

Bob Wills' birthday was celebrated in good fashion by our own **Butch Gibson & Pardners**. Butch has such a touching way of bringing Bob Wills' legacy in music here to us as we remember his life and contributions.

Pardners took the stage featuring Judy Hayes on bass, Larry Broad on guitar, Jim Hollinger on drums and Wayne Franco on

steel. Butch handled most of the vocals, kicking off the afternoon of music and dancing with *Time Changes Everything. (I confess, the words of the song made me think of what I don't want to change.)* The enthusiastic crowd danced and danced to show their sincere support. *Keeper of My Heart* and *Bubbles in My Beer* gave the dancers a good start and by the time the band hit the first chords of the *Bandera Waltz*, the Showcase was in full swing!

Wayne Franco stirred things up with *Steel Guitar Rag* . . . wow! Brenda Jacobs sat and marveled at his talent. *From a Jack to a King* and *Cherokee Maiden*, followed by *Dinah* and *Mexicali Rose*, certainly spanned the diverse musical styles embraced by western swing. Larry chose Honeysuckle Rose, then, continued with an instrumental, a cha cha, for the dancers. When Butch came back to sing one of Patsy Cline's biggest hits, *You Belong to Me*, I could see wife, Kelly, smiling with love.

Slow Poke, Deep Water, Roly Poly and Walkin' the Floor Over You kept the dance floor full. We thought it couldn't get any better when, to the delight of many, the band cut loose on Sugar Moon then Butch crooned

September in the Rain.

Pardners closed their portion of the March Showcase with My Shoes Keep Walking Back to You and Waltz Across Texas. Thank you, Pardners, for putting together such a fine musical tribute to Bob Wills.

Time for door prizes, donated in part by Sharon Capps and myself. People love that special time during the showcase. Special thanks also to Margie Phillips, who donated CDs for the Society to offer for donations to the

Bob Wills, the King of Western Swing

Each year Cain's Ballroom celebrates the birthday of the one and only Bob Wills. Bob Wills was born into a family of fiddlers where he learned to play the fiddle and mandolin. As a young man, Wills performed at house dances, medicine shows and on the radio. On New Year's night 1935, he made his debut at Cain's and the venue soon became known as "The Home of Bob Wills." This year's celebration was held on Saturday, March 5th, and led by The Texas Playboys, featuring Leon Rausch, Tommy Allsup, Johnny Cox, Monty Gaylord and Shaun Howe to name a few

As The Home of Bob Wills and The Texas Playboys from 1935 to 1942, the ballroom was especially significant for popularizing a new sound of western music called western swing, a form of country and western that combined jazz, hillbilly, boogie, blues, big band swing, rhumba, mariachi and jitterbug music. Weekly dances, a midnight radio show and a daily noon-hour program were played by Bob Wills during what are remembered as his "glory years."



I'm sure most of us have either used or heard of the slang term "Cut a Rug" or "Cutting the Rug." It is always used in regards to dancing. 'They sure can cut a rug!...Did you see that couple Cut that Rug?' It simply means to dance. Some definitions indicate the term became popular in the 1920's and writers use the phrase to take us back to that period of time.

I came across something indicating that it dates much older than that period. It seems that in the 1800's, the pioneers traveling across our great country would amuse themselves by cutting a rug out of tarp laying it on the ground so as not to soil the ladies dresses for an evening of dancing. As an added bonus, the rug or tarp would keep dust in check during the entertainment. Someone would have a fiddle or guitar and, if they were lucky, they might both instruments in the covered wagon or cow camp. So the term "Cut the Rug" was and is today related to dancing.

Dancing here in Texas is apart of our culture. Many of us learned to dance Texas style from our parents and grandparents in our historic German and Czech halls. These halls were/are family places, where young and old gather together for entertainment or meetings. When we dance Western Swing it's with a Texas flavor, doing a two-step, three step, polka or waltz with swing rhythm using some of our own creativity. Usually, you won't see west or east coast swing much, although folks from other parts of the country do and it's welcome. We want to see people enjoying themselves and our culture.

Western Swing music was especially designed for dancing. It was a country version of Big Band Swing that was popular during the 30-40s. Many soldiers from the south were stationed in California during World War II and it was an extremely popular form of entertainment. Thousands would frequent the dance halls on the west coast piers.

Something that concerns many is the noticeable 20-year gap between those you see in the dance halls today. In the smaller towns or on the outskirts of the big cities you'll find more



youthful dancers as that is their Saturday night entertainment, closer to home. When that age group is present at city dances, we can see that they watch our feet, studying and counting the steps. It appears they're interested but don't get up and try. We're looking for ways to get them on the dance floors, some for the first time. We just want them to get up "cut a rug" and enjoy what has been happening here for generations so this unique Texas culture continues.


