President's Report: The 2017 Nominees and their sponsors have been notified of the Selection Committee's decisions. A listing of the 2017 Inductees has been posted on the website and Facebook. Earlier this month, letters of invitation went out to bands, inviting them to perform at this year's Festival.

The Oregon Valley Boys have been hired to play for the King County Fair. They will be performing twice on the main stage on Sunday afternoon, tentatively beginning around 4:00 pm. Instead of an annual picnic at the Bischoff's this July, I would like to encourage everyone to come out to the King County Fair on July 16 to support the band and promote the August Festival.

During the King County Fair, the NWWSMS has been offered the opportunity put up an information table in the building for non-profits as well as a table next to the main stage during the performance of The **Oregon Valley Boys**. There will be further discussion on this with the Expo Center staff. We would need volunteers to staff the tables.

Treasurer: Treasurer Dave Wheeler presented the financial reports.

Bills: Approved to pay.

Committee Reports:

Newsletter/Website/Facebook: Jeanne Yearian reports that Festival information has been posted. This information as well as the link to purchase tickets on-line through Brown Paper Tickets has been posted on a flyer as well as the website. The Enumclaw Expo Center has sent the Festival information along with the link to Brown Paper Tickers to the person who maintains their website as well.

Membership Update: Dave Wheeler reports 229 paid-up members, with 12 new so far this year. The postcard mailing has been successful, with responses from some members.

Showcase: Sharon Smith reported that the host band for today is Kristi Nebel and Cowgirl's Dream. June's host band will be Paul Cooper & Pickin' Coop. The September host band will be Steel Country.

Sunshine: In Lou Bischoff's absence, Jeanne Yearian provided an update.

Festival Committee: Jeanne and Fred Yearian met with several of the Board members and volunteers to tour the Field House. They have hung several bankers' partitions on the back wall which has helped to some extent with the reverberation. We are waiting for information from the Expo Center on the next payment due on the venue, State Fair participation, the possibility of a monthly Western Swing jam scheduled, and a list of caterers.

Invitations have gone out to 24 bands. If anyone knows of a band that was expecting an invitation but has not received one, please let Jeanne Yearian know.

We are pleased to announce that The Jangles and Bobby Flores and the Yellow Rose Band will be performing on Friday evening. The Oregon Valley Boys are scheduled on Saturday evening, Bonnie Guitar is planning to attend the Induction Ceremony on Sunday; no news yet on whether she will be performing. Bands representing both the Southwest and Sacramento Societies will be performing as well as Bob Dolle & his Hall of Fame Variety Band.

We are looking forward to receiving raffle items during the coming months. Our NWWSMS trailer will be an item for the silent auction.

Scholarship/Workshop Committee Report:

Jerry Seitz reports the workshops have been successful. He will have a debriefing with Paul Flliiot

Unfinished Business:

JBLM Music Therapy Program Update: The paperwork has been submitted for approval of a private donation from Sharon Smith. Sharon and Alice Striegel will be transporting the instruments and equipment to the base. Gary Ouellette, the Program Director, will meet them, drive their vehicle to the Warrior Transition Battalion and give them a tour if the facility.

Update on finding a western swing band to represent the Society for 2017: Paul Elliott has also expressed an interest in helping to develop a band . . . more to come.

Request for a South Sound Jam: A request has been received by one of the Scholarship Recipients (Sheila Ryan) that a western swing jam session be set up closer to Olympia. Jeanne Yearian will contact the Expo Center to discuss the possibility of western swing locations in Enumclaw.

New Business: A new committee (Jerry Seitz, Dave Wheeler and Mike Schweedler) has been formed to research obtaining grants.

The meeting's minutes were read and approved by the Board members present. Motion passed to adjourn at 12:40 am.



Claude "Chuck" Woods, of Sun City, Calif., passed away on Saturday, May 13, 2017.

Chuck was born in Canton, Georgia. At an early age his parents moved Athens. Tennessee. where Chuck

attended school and started singing on local radio station WLAR with the Coleman Brothers Band and the Dixie Playboys. Chuck and the Dixie Playboys performed all over the South at schools and theaters.

In 1944, Chuck went to Knoxville, Tennessee, and appeared on radio station WNOX on a program called "The Midday Merry -Go-Round," with the Carlise Brothers and Cowboy Copas. In 1948, Chuck moved to Dayton, Ohio, and went to work at the Maple Gardens with Luck Moore, traveling around Ohio and Michigan doing shows...

In 1949, Chuck went to work at the Roosevelt Lounge in Detroit, Michigan. It was a large Western Swing nightclub where Chuck performed in several shows with Moon Mullican. Hawkshaw Hawkins. Sheets McDonald, Elton Britt and others. Chuck was inducted into the Western Swing Hall of Fame in Sacramento, California, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and Seattle, Washington.

He was in the Army for a brief period of time, then moved to the San Diego, Calif., area in 1955. He was retired from General Dynamics where he worked as an Engineer for 30 years. He also served on the board as Union Vice President.

Over the years, Chuck has promoted over 80 benefit shows for sick and disabled musicians and their families. He also used to put on shows at the Navy Hospital in San Diego for Vietnam Vets who were recuperating from wounds received in Vietnam. He was a 32nd Degree Mason and also a Scottish Rite Mason.

He was a blessing in many lives and was a blessed man in his life.

Ellen Jean O'Malley, Dec. 25, 1937, he graduated from Arlington Heights High School and attended special classes at SMU.

First employed at a bakery, he later organized the Jr. Brownies Band. After serving two years in the U.S. Navy, he became a City of Fort Worth Fire-fighter, retiring as a Battalion

In retirement, he returned to music as a guitarist/singer, with a band headed by the late Joe Grady Thomas, the Fiddle-dee-dees. They were contract performers at Six Flags Over Texas eight years in a row. Other gigs included Dion's, in the Apparel Mart, Dallas; various businesses; several retirement centers, and private affairs.

Roy Lee was voted by his colleagues as a hero of western swing music, and was inducted into the Cowtown Society of Western Music in that category. He was inducted into two western swing music society halls of fame; the Texas Western Swing Music Society, San Marcos, Texas and NorthWest Western Swing Music Society in Seattle, Washington.

Roy Lee strived most of his life for the rightful place in the history of Western Swing music, of his brothers Milton and Derwood Brown, who were also Hall of Fame inductees. He coauthored a properly documented, informative book about their music and the Musical Brownies Band.

Roy Lee was a lifelong member of Arlington Heights Baptist Church. He was preceded in death by: Ellen, his wife of 75 years; his parents; sister, Era Lee; brother, Milton Brown; nephew, Buster Lee Brown; brother, Derwood Brown; and nephew, Ronald Brown.

Roy Lee will be missed by all whose life he touched.

The party actually started on Friday, May 5th with a free 8 hour jam session. Brady Bowen headed up a spectacular group of musicians as they played some of the all-time favorite western swing tunes. We have to give Elmer Laurance a big pat on the back. I don't think he ever got up from his steel guitar except for maybe one small break. He, along with the other great musicians enjoy their craft so much, they lose track of time.

Louise Rowe and The Texan Playboys played a rousing musical set of old, well-known western swing favorites and filled up the dancefloor, followed by Cowjazz




DJ of the Year, Chuck Ramsey and wife, Gina




