Western swing is a wild and wonderful mélange of vintage jazz, swing, fiddle tunes, old-style country, blues, ragtime, Mexican polkas and more. Hot solos and jazzy arrangements were mandatory, and bands like Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys were top draws in Texas throughout the 1930s - '50s.

Since Western Swing was officially declared the music of the State of Texas in 2011, this distinctly American mix of musical styles is being taught at the college level on several campuses in the Southwest. Curious as to why this musical genre is growing and it's Pacific Northwest connection?

Due to the interest shown in last year's workshops, the NorthWest Western Swing Music Society is continuing to offer a free introduction to America's western swing music this Spring! The April workshops will be held at the Dusty Strings Music School in Seattle. All ages, ability levels and instruments are welcome. Learn how to play, what to play and when to play!

These first two workshops in April will be leading up to a full-scale, 6-hour western swing band clinic which will be held at the Lake City Eagles from 10 am to 4 pm on Saturday, May 14th (food available). Several rooms are reserved at both locations in April and May, so we will have lots of opportunity to break down into smaller groups for more personalized instruction.

Western Swing is music made for dancing. So, adding to the music experience May 14th at the Lake City Eagles will be western swing dance instruction taught by MaryLee Lykes.

MINUTES FROM THE BOARD FEBRUARY 14, 2016

Present by Verbal Role Call: Lou Bischoff, Jerry Seitz, Sharon Smith, Alice Striegel, Dave Wheeler.

Excused: Sharon Capps, Dave DuChane, Shelley McNaughton.

Treasurer: No report in the absence of the Treasurer; however, Secretary Alice Striegel reported that the Society's liability insurance policy has been paid by check to the Leavitt Group Northwest for another year. Alice also updated the Board on the status of the Society's original bank account with US Bank.

Bills: Approved to pay.

Committee Reports:

Newsletter/Website: Jeanne Yearian reported that, due to the wide geographical area covered by our members, the Newsletter will try to include western swing-related events and articles from a greater area as well as DJ Top Tens from many locales. Motion made, voted on and approved to renew our website with Hostgator for another 3 years.

Membership Committee Report: Dave Wheeler reported that currently the NWWSMS has 204 paid up members with 30 new members in 2015. A 2016 membership roster is in the process of being compiled. To be included or excluded on this roster, members must submit information by April 30, 2016. It is planned to have the roster ready for distribution at the August festival. Motion made, voted on and approved to establish a March 30 deadline to submit information for future year's inclusion/ exclusion.

Sunshine: Lou Bischoff updated "Sharing the Journey."

Showcase: Lou Bischoff reported that the host band in March will be Butch Gibson and Pardners. The NWWSMS monthly showcases are now appearing on Ron Bolin's Dance

Hall of Fame: Jeanne Yearian reports that the contract between NWWSMS and the Auburn Eagles has been signed. A copy of the liability insurance renewal will be taken to the Eagles next week to meet the last condition of the contract. Motel information appeared in the February Newsletter. Fourteen completed nominations have been received. Members of

the 2016 Nominating Committee will be scheduling a meeting after March 15.

Steve Carter has generously offered to make/ donate a commemorative guilt for the raffle. Other raffle prizes will be needed.

Workshop Report: Jerry Seitz reported that two workshops have been scheduled at Dusty Strings in April. Workshops will be staffed by Paul Elliott, Pete Martin and Elena DeLisle-Perry.

Unfinished Business:

2016 Budgets: Budgets were received from the Educational/Workshop Committee, the Newsletter/Website Committee and the Festival / HOF Committee. Motion made, voted on and approved to accept the budgets as submitted.

People's Choice Award: At today's Showcase, the NWWSMS Traveling Trophy will be presented to the Country Fever Band. This group received the most 'votes' as the favorite host band of 2015. Voting raised \$342.00, paying for the trophy, with the balance going into the NWWSMS Educational Fund.

New Business: There was no new business to report.

Good of the Order: Louise Hamel donated a box of audio CDs to the Society. Edd Burnett asked for several copies of the Steel Guitar Grand Jam. His intention is to offer them for donations at the next two events hosted by the Western Swing Society of the Southwest. All monies collected will be donated to the NWWSMS' Educational/Scholarship Committee in memory of Chuck Hayes.

The meeting's minutes were read and approved by the board members present. Motion passed to adjourn at 12:20 pm.

We are so pleased to have **Butch** Gibson and Pardners playing for the



Many years ago a fiddler named Bob Wills formed a band. He called it the Texas Playboys, and it soon became the most popular band in the Southwest. The Texas Playboys called their music western swing—a glorious mélange of old jazz and pop tunes, fiddle tunes, cowboy songs, waltzes, Mexican polkas and swing numbers.

Paul Anastasio (Church Point), former fiddler with Merle Haggard and Asleep at the Wheel, assembled a truly all-star cast to showcase the music of Bob Wills on Saturday, March 12 at Eunice's Liberty Theater.

Joining Paul is a killer fiddle section, featuring David Greely, John Buckelew, Joel Savoy and future star Celebrindal Roberts.

We'll have Ann Savoy, Kelli Jones-Savoy, Megan Brown and Gary Newman, as well as fiddlers David and John on vocals.

And watch your blood pressure... the heartbeat of the band is carried by Wilson Savoy on piano, Gary on bass and Albanie Falletta, the pride of New Orleans, on guitar and vocals. Talk about world class!

Western swing music is truly timeless. Don't miss Bob Wills Night—a heartfelt salute to the hot dance music that took the world by storm back in the 1930s and '40s and has continued to swing mightily ever since.



32ND ANNUAL

SIDEMAN JAMBOREE

MUSIC FESTIVAL & FILMING OF DOCUMENTARY IN BOWIE, AZ

The Sideman Jamboree, a music festival that began in 1984, had it's $32^{\rm nd}$ annual festival on February 5, 6, and 7, 2016, in Bowie, Arizona, at the Alaskan RV Park, located at 1293 E Music Road, Bowie, AZ 85643, off exit 366 of I-10.

Each February for the past 32 years, hundreds of musicians from all over the country have driven their RVs to "Music Road" outside of Bowie, Arizona. Each night the performances are from 6pm until 8pm. Many of the past musicians at the festival had illustrious careers as sidemen and sidewomen to some of the biggest names in western swing music and country music. They called their musical jam "Sideman Jamboree" because it was their turn to perform center stage.

"The reason we call the music festival *Sideman Jamboree* is because there are no leaders and everyone is equal and welcome to perform center stage. Musicians come from all over the United States and take turns playing," said 90-year -old Sideman Jamboree founder and matriarch Judy Hall.

The festival takes place on a stage in a barn at the Alaskan RV Park, All three nights, there will be a potluck dinner at 5pm and everyone is asked to bring a dish to share. The featured performances begin at 6pm each night, but on Saturday and Sunday there will be an open jam session for the public from 3pm – 5pm. The event is free, and all ages are welcome.

A documentary film is being made about Sideman Jamboree and has been filmed during the event. Eric Troyer, singer and keyboardist for the iconic classic-rock band of ELO and ELO Pt 2 former members, The Orchestra (who was also background vocalist on John Lennon's "Woman," Billy Joel's "Uptown Girl," and Bonnie Tyler's "Total Eclipse of the Heart," and others), is one of the producers of the documentary.

"Our documentary film is about the musical genre of western swing, its origins and influences, both past and present, as told through the eyes of the Sideman Jamboree music festival, where the sparks still fly, the old meet the new, and the love and devotion still shine on," explained Troyer.

Current and past performers at Sideman Jamboree include:

Judy Hall, whose music career started at the age of 14. She has toured with Jimmy Rav Dean, Sara Vaughan, Ernest Tubb, Merle Haggard, Waylon Jennings, George Strait, Jimmy Buffet, Hank Thompson and



Tennessee Ernie Ford, among others. Today Judy can still be found singing and dancing during Sideman Jamboree.

Bud Isaacs, the inventor of a line of pedal steel guitars who teamed with fellow country music performer Shot Jackson to form the Sho-Bud Company. Bud performed with Eddie Hill, Little Jimmy Dickens, Chet Atkins, Homer Haynes, Jethro Burns (Homer and Jethro), and Dale Potter. Isaacs formed an act called the Golden West Singers with his wife Geri Mapes, a yodeller, singer and bass player. He was inducted into the Steel Guitar Hall Of Fame in 1984.

Sons of the Pioneers, one of America's earliest Western singing groups. Roy Rogers was one of the founding members, many of whom have participated in Sideman Jamboree over the years, including last year's performer, Mark Abbott.

Glynn Duncan, brother of Tommy Duncan and a former Bob Wills' Texas Playboy.

Randy Elmore, former Bob Wills' Texas Playboy, and champion left-handed fiddle player from Texas.

Billy Easton, world-renowned pedal steel player, and Chairman of the Southwestern Steel Guitar Association.

Ray Harrison, a local-Arizona musician who was just inducted into the NorthWest Western Swing Music Society.


