Happy Birthday, Bob!

Pictured left, "The King of Western Swing," Bob Wills. He was born on March 6 in 1905 and is captured in this photo celebrating his 64th birthday at The Cain's Ballroom, Tulsa, OK, on March 1, 1969.

And they still celebrate the birthday of Bob Wills at Cain's Ballroom. This year, the Bob Wills Birthday Bash took place on March 3.

The rich partnership between Bob Wills, his Texas Playboys and Cain's began on New Year's Night in 1935. (There is a book being written on the history of Cain's Ballroom, but for now here's the way we heard it told.)

Bob Wills was born into a family of fiddlers where he learned to play the fiddle and mandolin. As a young man, Wills performed at house dances, medicine shows and on the radio. On New Year's Night 1935, he made his debut at Cain's and the venue soon became known as "The Home of Bob Wills."

As The Home of **Bob Wills and The Texas Playboys** from 1935 to 1942, the ballroom was especially significant for popularizing a new sound of western music called western swing, a form of country and western that combined jazz, hillbilly, boogie, blues, big band swing, rhumba, mariachi and jitterbug music. Weekly dances, a midnight radio show and a daily noon-hour program were played by Bob Wills during what are remembered as his "glory years."



have had instruments donated as well as cash. The trophy for the 2017 Showcase Band of the Year will be presented before the jam begins. Participation in the contest increased over the past two years and the winner is Southern Comfort.

Jeanne Yearian showed the committee a book she compiled with photos from the 2017 festival. The suggestion was made that the book be on display at the festival for pre-sale of the 2018 edition be offered to festival participants and inductees. The price would be around \$30.00 for a 20-page book.

Nominations are coming in for Inductees into the 2018 Hall of Fame. If you receive nominations, please send them on to Jeanne Yearian.

Discussion of letter received from Robert Huston regarding the Baker family fundraiser was left open. Jeanne Yearian will check on board members once they have had more time to think about the NWWSMS participation in this fundraiser.

Sharon Smith reported Treasurer's Report: Quickbooks Pro 2018 and Office 2016 have been installed on the Society's laptop. Due to family matters, the hand-off of the books and membership list from last year has been delayed. During the past month, the signature card was updated and mailbox duties transferred.

Sharon Smith, Jeanne Yearian and Shellev McNaughton will meet with Dave Wheeler on February 17 to transfer the books and membership listina.

To help out with the transition, Dave Wheeler has filed the 2017 federal taxes for the Society.

2018 Western Swing Festival: This month Jeanne will pay the balance due to the Enumclaw Expo Center for the festival. Invitation letters to perform at the festival will be sent out to the bands of all three Societies later this month. An invitation for service organizations to handle catering this year's event was published in the newsletter. If no one responds by the end of March, we will approach the caterer we had last year. Jeanne asked for volunteers for the Festival Planning Committee. Volunteers for the Festival Planning Committee do not need to be members of the board.

Update on finding a Western Swing band to represent the Society for 2018: Western Swing band to represent the Society in Enumclaw's 4th of July Parade: Toby Hansen has offered to organize a band. He is looking for a bass player and guitar player to join him on the float.

Good of the Order: Shelley McNaughton expressed how much it meant to Willie Carter and his family for him to be inducted into the NWWSMS Hall of Fame. During Willie's memorial service, his certificate, star and bio were prominently displayed. This recognition for his music made a difference to him and those who were important to him.

The meeting's minutes were read and approved by the Board members present. Motion passed to adjourn at 12:09 pm.

symphony and for two years, and led the second violin section of a 93-piece orchestra. That was in Amarillo, Texas,

The family moved to Oklahoma. At that time Gene decided to play country music. He wanted to play the steel guitar but his dad said, "No, you are going to play the fiddle." Gene put his first band together and started playing dances. Then the folks moved to Perryton, Texas. Gene worked as a plumber's helper to make enough money to move to Fresno, California and started playing western swing music there.

Gene went to Yosemite and started playing with the Diamond G Trio. He heard that Bob Wills was playing at Wills Point so he moved to Sacramento to apply for a job with the Texas Playboys. Instead he became a piano player for Loyd Frankini. At that time he met Glenn Tarver and they started playing twin fiddles. Gene joined the Ole Rasmussen Band, the Nebraska Corn Huskers, and was Ole's band leader.

At that time Gene met Juanita, who was singing where he was playing. They were married in 1959, and were among the founders of the Western Swing Society, serving in its early years as officers and volunteers. He and Juanita were among the founders of the Western Swing Society and served for many years as officers and volunteers.

Gene joined the Loyd Jones Western Swing Band, where he remained for forty years playing with the best musicians. He was inducted into the Western Swing Hall Of Fame in 1982 and the Pioneers of Western Swing Hall Of Fame in Seattle, Washington in 1969.

Gene and Juanita, who is also a Western Swing Hall of Fame member, moved Reno Nevada, where he started playing with Kenny Lowrey, a former member of Billy Jack Wills' band.

Gene passed away on January 7, 2018 following a series of health problems. He always said he felt blessed for his music and his wife. Juanita, and their children and grandchildren. He was an energetic presence on the bandstand, fiddling and singing for the dancers, and will remain in the memory of all who heard him play.



Bob Wills is remembered as "The of Western King Swing." He was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1978, into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1999 and received a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 2007 for his significant contributions to American music from the 1930s through the 1960s.

During his career, Wills wrote and recorded at least 470 songs, including "Take Me Back to Tulsa" and

"San Antonio Rose," and he influenced such artists as Willie Nelson, Merle Haggard and Asleep at the Wheel.

Cain's is known throughout the music industry as not only "The Home of Bob Wills," but also as the "Carnegie Hall of Western Swing."

Built in 1924 by Tulsa entrepreneur Tate Brady, The Cain's Ballroom has gone from a garage, a dime-a-dance joint and a dancing academy until it became what is known by artists and patrons alike as one of the top performance venues in the world today.

The highlight of the ballroom is a historic maple, spring loaded dance floor designed in a "log cabin" or concentric square pattern. Lighting the dance floor is a four-foot neon star and a silver disco ball. The walls are decorated with oversized photographs of various musicians who played Cain's, including Bob Wills, Johnnie Lee Wills, Ernest Tubb, Hank Williams, Tex Ritter, Kay Starr and Tennessee Ernie Ford. Between the portraits are black fiddle-shaped fixtures illuminated by a single red bulb.
