In the categories for Western Swing alone there were 35 nominations for male vocalist, 29 for female vocalist, 44 for duo/group, 26 for song, 19 for album and 33 nominations for instrumentalist of year.

New Business:


Motion was made, voted on and approved to amend the current NWWSMS Articles of Incorporation back to the wording of the 1984 Articles of Incorporation.

FEEDBACK . . .

The Kind That Makes You Cover Your Ears

When using sound reinforcement (aka; a sound system), often feedback will occur during setup and adjustment of the system. This usually occurs without warning and sends the sound engineer a clear message to try and quickly mute the system since feedback will literally 'feed' on itself.

THE CAUSE: In engineering terms, feedback is actually an oscillation where the amplitude is just about at the peak level that the system can produce. It is sure to wake everybody up. It is caused when the loop gain at some frequency exceeds unity. The frequency of oscillation (pitch) depends on the delay both in the acoustic/mechanical path and that of the electronics, including

microphone, amplifier and speaker(s).

The acoustic path is the least predictable, and when something

changes in that path, say a musician moves from in front of a mic, suddenly the system goes unstable and the signature, ear-piercing feedback occurs.

Please note that while a system may seem to be stable, if an instrument just happens to generate some energy at or near a frequency where this feedback is lurking, the system may take off and oscillate. At professional venues they often take several hours to do sound checks and find where these feedback frequencies are




in the complete sound environment. For our small venues we don't get the chance to search these out and analyze the true source.

CASE STUDY: A HIDDEN FEEDBACK SOURCE AND ITS FIX A few months ago at the NWWSMS showcase, a feedback occurred at around 100 Hz which is close to a G2 note and a wavelength of about 3.5 meters (approximately 10 feet). This is uncommonly low for feedback to occur. The system was barely held stable by inserting about 40 Db of notch filter at 100 Hz. That means that the feedback had 10,000 times the gain it needed to oscillate. At the time, I had no resources to isolate the path this feedback was taking, so all I could do was throttle the gain back to stop the feedback when it would start. That low frequency is NOT something one hears when the stage monitors are feeding into the mics. Those monitor-mic feedback paths create a high, ear-piercing pitch. From experience with the Country Fever band on the Auburn Eagles stage I suspected what the low frequency culprit was and tested a fix at the next showcase.

The cause of this low frequency feedback had to have a mechanical delay to create the right phase. In addition, a low note by the bass guitar near the G2 note would excite the oscillation that would then sustain. The root cause was the use of the solid base mic stands on a stage surface that vibrates with the music. This added vibration then coupled into the mics. The fix was to use foam pads under the mic stand bases. The feedback was silenced until somebody moved one of the stands off the pad during the fourth set at which time the oscillation started again and verified the cause!

PREVENTIVE MEASURES: The usual way we "ring out" feedback is to do a sound check. With monitor gain up fairly high, one makes a "chussing" sound at each mic. The idea is to create a noise at the mic containing a broad spectrum of frequencies that will excite any marginal feedback paths. One can hear the system start to "ring" as feedback is approached and filters can be linked into the monitor paths to reduce the gain at the frequency(s) that might become unstable. This check is hard to do when there are patrons present as the system may take off with a very loud squeal.



There are many other factors that can cause feedback. Acoustic guitars are very prone to feedback if tied directly into the system and a sound hole plug is not used. Fiddles with pickups are an especially hot source that can lead to feedback

There is also what is known as 'local' feedback from personal equipment on the stage. Have you ever noticed how careful musicians are not to face their instruments directly in front of their amps? Guitar players, try this experiment: hold your guitar in front of your amp and let the strings be vibrated by the sound coming from the speaker. You can actually see the strings start to build up oscillation.

THE BOTTOM LINE: To sum it up, without a comprehensive sound check, nasty feedback can occur at any time for various reasons.

The Fraternal Order of Eagles, an international non-profit organization, unites fraternally in the spirit of liberty, truth, justice, and equality, to make human life more desirable by lessening its ills, and by promoting peace, prosperity, gladness and hope.

The Fraternal Order of Eagles was founded on February 6, 1898. The organization was formed by six theater owners sitting on a pile of lumber in Moran's shipyard in Seattle, Washington. They were competitors who had come together to discuss a musicians' strike. After deciding how to handle the strike, they agreed to "bury the hatchet" and form an organization dubbed, "The Order of Good Things."

Early meetings were held on local theater stages, and after taking care of business, attendees rolled out a keg of beer and enjoyed social time. As numbers grew, participants selected the bald eagle as the official emblem and changed the name to "The Fraternal Order of Eagles." In April, 1898, the membership formed a Grand Aerie, secured a charter and developed a constitution and by-laws, with John Cort elected the Eagles' first president. Touring theater troupes are credited with much of the Eagles' rapid growth. Most early members were actors, stagehands and playwrights, who carried the Eagles story as they toured across the United States and Canada.

"People helping people" is a statement that guides the charitable actions of the Fraternal Order of Eagles and has led the Eagles to donate more than \$100 million annually. As part of the charitable philosophy, the Eagles give back 100 percent of the contributions received in the form of grants. All administrative costs are paid by the International Organization through membership dues.












HELLO FROM DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS!

We live on the same road as where you'll find Luckenbach, a mere 30 Texas miles

down the road. We travel a little further here to find music and dance than most do. It's just down the road a ways.

Luckenbach isn't a town at all, although it was many years ago. It's a place where jam sessions, music and dance happen well off the beaten path. Thanks to Willie and Wayland the place received national and international recognition with their tune, Luckenbach, Texas. For awhile the State Department of Transportation installed location signs only to have them taken by souvenir seekers. It got to be an expensive undertaking. There's not a lot of folks that live in the area mostly ranchers. The only establishments are the old post office/store building and the dance hall where many of the famous have played. Down the road a bit is a feed store.

Every Friday night there is a free dance where local bands play time-worn Texas dance hall tunes for the tourists and some locals. Luckenbach is one of only two of our historic dance halls that operate on a daily basis. The other hall is Gruene, (green) Hall, near New Braunfels, TX. (We'll cover that hall a little later.) Every day in the summer jam sessions are held under the huge live oak tree. You'll hear an array of fine musicians, song writers and singers there under the tree beside the bar. In the winter they'll move inside around the wood burning stove. Willie used to have his July 4th picnic there until the population grew to the thousands. Asleep at the Wheel, Doug Moreland, Gary P Nunn, Johnny Gimble (of course), Willie and Wayland and many others have played there.

Chickens roam the grounds and roost in that same huge tree next to the bar where the musicians gather during those summer jam sessions. And yep, you've got watch how long you sit under that tree in the evenings. One rooster joins the entertainers, sitting on the back of the chair with the group. He

seems to be taking it all in. We've not witnessed him joining in. however.

Several cats call the property home. One in particular seems to have the run of the place, easily moving from one building to another. We've been personally scooted over so we can enjoy her company on several occasions.

It's a laid back, no fuss, no worry type of place, much like the picture painted through the words of it's famous tune.

Oh, but you can't beat the opportunity to dance on a great hardwood floor! Everybody is somebody in Luckenbach, Texas, ... one slogan that meets up to it's hype.


