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Steel Guitar Revolutionary Bud Isaacs Has Died

IN THE REPORT OF THE PARTY OF THE PARTY OF

The seminal instrument of country music would not sound the same, and many of country's golden hits would not be as sweet if it weren't for Bud Isaacs, and now he's gone. A member of the

Steel Guitar Hall of Fame, a player on countless country music recordings and once member of the Ozark Jubilee, Bud Isaacs was vital to helping form the sound of country music.

Bud Isaacs wasn't just a steel guitar player, he was the man who revolutionized the instrument by adding the foot and knee pedals that allow the steel guitar to change the pitch of singles strings as opposed to having to change to a different chord all at the same time. This made Bud Isaacs and other steel guitar players the musical wizards of the day able to emulate the moans and yodels of country's legendary singers with the steel's mournful tone.

Born March 28th, 1928, in Bedford, Indiana, he began to play steel guitar on local radio stations at the age of 16, eventually heading to Nashville and performing on the Grand Ole Opry with Eddie Hill, and later in Jimmy Dickens' Country Boys. Webb Pierce's 1954 hit "Slowly" was the first major song to feature Bud Isaacs' new take on the steel guitar, and it revolutionized the instrument, and country music with it.

President's Report: Nominating Committee appointments for next month's annual meeting will be made. The Committee should look for nominations among the membership (alternates on the Board would be welcome) and make sure the candidates have paid their dues for this year. The Treasurer's position will be open.

A short meeting will take place before today's jam session to vote on the revision to the By-Laws to further clarify who is a voting member of the NWWSMS. As presented to the Board at the August meeting, the change consists of adding the word "voting" in two places.

President Jeanne Yearian asked the Board to think about a 50/50 percentage split of the earnings from the silent auction and the raffle between the General Fund and the Educational/Scholarship Fund; additional expenses in the future could be significant since we have to find a new location for the Hall of Fame Festival. Motion made, seconded and approved to a 50/50 percentage split.

Treasurer: Treasurer Sharon Capps presented the financial report.

Bills: Approved to pay.

Committee Reports:

Membership Update: Dave Wheeler reported there are currently 216 paid-up members with 8 new members to date in 2016.

Showcase: Due to health issues, Lou Bischoff will be retiring from this Board assignment, effective immediately. Sharon Smith will assist until the end of the year. The October host band will be the Board Band. In November the Society will welcome a new western swing band formed through the workshop program. The Go Outside and Playboys band, featuring Pete Martin and Elena DeLisle, two of our workshop instructors, are the co-founders.

Scholarship/Workshop Committee Report: Jerry Seitz presented a proposal for the 2017 workshop sessions. Motion passed to accept the proposed budget as a starting point.

Newsletter/Website/Facebook Report: Jeanne Yearian reported that the Festival/Hall of Fame information will be updated during October.

Hall of Fame Committee: Jeanne Yearian reported everyone has been so helpful in bringing

New Business:

Search for 2017 Festival Venue: Jeanne Yearian prepared and presented to the Board and Society members a form that could be used to search for a festival venue. As many people as possible need to be involved in this hunt. Venue reports can be returned to the Board members.

Good of the Order: Lou received many favorable comments on this year's festival. She has also received apologies from some who had hoped to attend. Red and Joan Gillean expressed their sincere regrets over missing this year's events. They have only missed 2 of the 26 festivals held.

The meeting's minutes were read and approved by the Board members present. Motion passed to adjourn at 12:25 pm.

Western Swing Forum

Following is a letter from Dick Heil, one of the cofounders of the NWWSMS¹



August 24, 2016

To the Board and Officers of the NWWSMS:

Since 1993 I have been trying to get an oversight corrected on our list of Hall of Famers and that is the omission of Earl Phelps. The 3 Phelps brothers, Norman, Earl and Willie, had a swinging good band based in Norfolk, VA, and recorded some great Decca records in the late 30s then later in the 40s and 50s recorded on Fernwood Records.

While stationed in Norfolk and Portsmouth in the Navy (1956 & 57), I sat in on piano and bass several times and we became good friends. Earl was a very, very swinging fiddle man and sang on most of the Decca's and needs an apology from the Society for omitting him every year a list was printed. I was chairman of the P.O.W.S. Award Selection Committee from 1991-1995 and had the final word on who was to be inducted but my efforts to correct the list seemed to be constantly ignored by the Society. Even though all three brothers have since passed away, this historical list of ours needs to be corrected.

Cherishing the Memories

(Editor's Note: The following italicized text was taken from Bud's induction bio for the NWWSMS.)

By age 14 he was traveling with Doc Abbott for \$7.00/week and experimenting with pedals for his guitar. He hopped a train to Nashville and landed a job with Pee Wee King but Grand Ole Opry founder, Judge Hayes, told him to go back home and go to school. He offered to give him a job when he was old enough.

Returning home he played with "Hobo Ramblers" Harold Fisher and on WIBC Radio with Cousin Emmie. At 20 Bud's path crossed that of Little Jimmy Dickens in Michigan. They remained best of friends throughout their lives.

In 1955, Isaacs became an official member of the Ozark Jubilee, and regularly performed with star Red Foley on the program. . . Isaacs also played as a solo performer and recorded for RCA for a short time, including the favorite "The Waltz You Saved For Me," and his signature song, "Bud's Bounce." Bud Isaacs' credits and the artists he played with are too numerous to list, and he also performed in the Golden West Singers with his wife, yodeler, and bass player Geri Mapes. Bud was inducted into several Halls of Fame, including the NWWSMS in 2000.

As country began to contemporize, there was less work for Bud Isaacs and he eventually retired in Arizona. According to Rick Jackson, Isaacs died on Sunday, September 4th at 11:00 a.m. A memorial service will be held at a later date. Cards can be sent to Geri at 12461 E. 38th Street Yuma, AZ 85367.



Kenny Lowery

Kenny Lowery was raised in Connecticut but, being a lover of the west, Kenny would sit through hours of Gene Autry films, listening to him sing and writing down the words to learn later. As a young man, Kenny packed his guitar and suitcase and hitched his way west.

He was working in Reno, Nevada, when he was offered a job with Bob Wills and his Texas Playboys. Bob told him to meet the bus in Fresno on Monday morning. Kenny had to hitchhike to Fresno and missed the bus. He hitched back to Reno.

Kenny took a job in Palm Springs and became friends with Cotton Roberts. The two joined together and headed back to Reno, working six nights a week.

Kenny became the rhythm guitar player in Billy Jack Wills Western Swing Band and moved to Wills Point in Sacramento. The band broadcast over KFBK daily, spreading western swing into the Northwest and Canada.

Kenny joined Bob when he took Billy's band to Los Angeles to record. He stayed with Bob after Wills Point burned. Heading to Oklahoma, Kenny found his wife was sick and quit the band while on the road. Bob gave him money to get back. Leaving the Texas Playboys was one of the hardest things he ever did.

Kenny retired in Reno, playing at senior centers and rest homes. He loved to entertain and his fans looked forward to seeing him until the end. He was inducted as a Pioneer of Western Swing into the NWWSMS Hall of Fame in 1997.

The headline in Tulsa World read: WESTERN SWING COMES BACK HOME FOR FESTIVAL

... reporting from the First Annual Will Rogers Swing Fest, held in Claremore, Oklahoma, at the Cherokee Casino, on Labor Day weekend.

Making travel plans for 2017? You might want to add this event to your list! This is the only western swing <u>festival</u> in Oklahoma. "There's a western swing festival on every corner in Texas," said musician Bob Fjeldsted, lead singer of The Round

Up Boys and festival director. . . . "Western swing might have been conceived in Texas, but it was born and raised right here in Tulsa." Of course, there are several western swing events held in Oklahoma, but this festival is a first. Four days of toe tapping, great music was scheduled and performed by both three Oklahoma-based bands:

- ★ The Round Up Boys (the show hosts)
- ★ Tulsa Playboys and
- ★ The Byron Berline Band

and three Texas bands:

- * Larry Lange and the Lone Star Troubadours
- * Billy Mata and the Texas Tradition, and
- ★ The Jason Roberts Band.

The music well-represented both sides of the Red River. All the bands had two, two-hour sets each day, so there was plenty of great music during Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Sunday morning gospel time was hosted by Bob Fjeldsted and The Round Up Boys.

Just a stone's throw away from the event center is the Cherokee Casino where food and beverages and some gaming *(if one desires)* is available. There was a dance floor and band

available on Friday and Saturday nights so, if you want to keep the party going on and on, this is the place.

The Will Rogers Downs is there, where periodic horse racing is held. The horse racing commission governs the facility which is owned by the Cherokee Tribe. The Tribe owns several casinos and hotels, 9 right now and 2 more are being built in the area. The Will Rogers Downs facility is in the process of being remodeled and updated.

If one would like to take in a little history tour, Will Rogers' home and museum is not far away. And, it's just 30 miles from Tulsa and the House that Bob Wills built, Cain's Ball Room. Close by is Cain's Walk of Fame. On Wednesday before the festival this year Bob Fjeldsted, himself, conducted tours of Cain's. In his words, "Folks coming in for this event want to go to Cain's. They wanted to see the stage. They want to stand on that dance floor and see where it all came from."



The room where the dances are held is large and can accommodate a large crowd of dancers. Tables and chairs are there for our use and libations are available on site. The casino restaurant has some great prices and the food is very tasty. Friday nights they have a prime rib dinner that is absolutely wonderful, so if you attend next year be sure to take in this feast!!

The music . . . what do you say about this great music? Not much need to explain to folks who know about western swing and traditional country music, other than to bring your boots - several pair if you have them. It's non-stop great music for dancing played by the best in the business. See you there next year!

Looking Back and to the Future: 4th SAN ANGELO COWBOY GATHERING by Terri Holland, Director

It's hard to believe that after a year's worth of planning, the San Angelo Cowboy

Gathering (SACG) has come and gone. For me, being the Director & Producer, it's kind of like giving birth to a new child each year. There is all the pre-event prepping, then you know it's coming but you just aren't completely ready yet, then the big day arrives and here we go - it's TIME! This year was no

exception to that, special music by talented artists, a dance floor FULL of people, vendors for shopping, and all to benefit a worthy cause, Meals for the Elderly in the Concho Valley.

We had the best artists in Western Swing, Traditional Country, and Western music, I believe to be found anywhere. Every one of them gave their very best performances and kept the dance floor jumping. We even had some guests & featured artists including Lucy Dean Record, Floyd Domino, Justin Trevino, and Larry Nix. They all did a tremendous job of keeping people on their feet dancing and their toes tapping.

This year the SACG sold out

again, with over 1100 in attendance during the 2-day event. We were still getting calls the very day of the event asking where people could buy wristbands. We had a few returned during the event that we were able to resell for folks, but I literally had a waiting list of those wanting to attend.

Here is my tip for all of you who didn't get in this year: Purchase those Sponsorships and General Admission wristbands early, don't procrastinate!

Dancers and western swing fans came this year from 92 cities across the great state of Texas, and nine other states were represented. Even a young couple from Canada attended this year's event. This year Meals for the Elderly was our recipient for a portion of our event funds, which includes our Live Auction held on Saturday afternoon. The live auction this year was the largest so far from year's past, we had 9 items up for the bidding and we raised almost \$3800. Yippee!!! There was a raffle this year too, which raised almost \$400 on one item, a basket with champagne, chocolates, and a weekend stay to Candlewood Suites Hotel.

Of course, having such a large event doesn't come without it's challenges. For example, it was really, really hot on Friday




San Angelo Cowboy Gathering - THEN In the beginning at Fort Concho

evening and having so many attendees in one large building makes space tight. The AC was cranked down to 64 on Friday, but having the doors open all day for Vendors and the Sound Crew to move in, meant the AC could never catch up once 1100 people showed up to dance! Saturday was much better as we left the AC on over night and the fact we received some much needed rain that morning cooled things down as well.

We feel that in 2017 we can address that heat issue by letting the vendors move in on Thursday afternoon, then shut the doors and crank the AC down all night. We

also feel that we will limit our number of vendors next year, in order to make more space between the tables without decreasing our LARGE dance floor.




