President's Report: Nominating Committee appointments for next month's annual meeting will be made. The Committee should look for nominations among the members (a few alternates on the Board would be welcome) and make sure that candidates have paid their dues for this year. We are losing two highly valued members of the Board - Dave Wheeler and Jerry Seitz. Both of these men will be greatly missed. not only for their enormous contributions to preserving and promoting Northwest western swing through the NWWSMS but also for their friendship. Nan Butler, who graciously agreed to stand in as an alternate, then filled for an absent member, will also be stepping down. In addition, Lou Bischoff will be officially retiring from the Board although she will continue sending cards to those who need encouragement and updating the list in the newsletter's Sharing the Journey column. Lots of opportunity for those who would like to make a contribution to promoting western swing in the Northwest!

Treasurer's Report: Dave Wheeler presented financial reports. Motion made, seconded and approved to pay dance instructor MaryLee Lykes out of the Scholarship Fund retroactive to January 1 rather than out of the General Fund as it was.

Committee Reports:

Membership: Dave Wheeler reports 237 total paid-up members, with 3 new members since July's report.

Showcase: Sharon Smith reports that Steel Country hosts the September Showcase; October will feature Southern Comfort; November's host will be JC McCormick and the Cherokee Band; December's host is yet to be determined. In January we will host a "Grand Jam." February will feature Sharyn Lee and the Sundowners. Butch Gibson and Pardners will host the March Showcase.

Sunshine: Lou Bischoff updated "Sharing The Journey."

2017 Festival and Hall of Fame: Much discussion occurred regarding the new site of the Festival, both pro and con! Jeanne and Fred Yearian met with Lacey and Scott at the Expo Center on Friday to discuss last August's Several issues Festival. discussed. Jeanne expressed how pleased we were with the facility and staff. It was agreed that the 2018 festival, celebrating the NWWSMS' 35th anniversary, be held again at the Expo Center. The Expo Center would like to help us build attendance and is looking into possible options: expanding State Fair participation/nonprofit booth; possibly adding a small stage with seating in the vendor building; making use of the free advertising available in the town if we have banners and flags printed; western swing dance lessons at the field house on Friday for the 4 weeks prior to the Festival (the Expo Center would possibly pay our instructor for doing this); having a band play at Kelly's Mercantile (a restaurant) in Enumclaw to promote the Festival (the band would play for tips which usually run from \$150-\$400); explore opportunities to attract dancers from Enumclaw and the surrounding communities; increasing signage during the event and promoting parking in Lot A (just 50 feet from the field house).

Unfinished Business:

The title for the trailer has been located and license tabs have been ordered. Butch Gibson has made an offer to purchase the trailer. Motion made, seconded and approved to accept his offer.

New Business: Alice Striegel asked for clarification of names on the "Adopt List" so that those members who do not have a computer will continue to receive the monthly NWWSMS Newsletter.

Good of the Order: We are proud to announce that two of the NWWSMS' Northwest musicians are being inducted into the Western Swing Society of Sacramento in October, Pat Rowe (HOF 2016) and Chet Hasting (HOF 2013). We encourage our members to attend the Induction Ceremony and celebration in Sacramento at the end of the month!

The meeting's minutes were read and approved by the Board members present. Motion passed to adjourn at 12:20 pm.



Hello, from deep in the Heart of Texas!

Hi there. It's been awhile. We've been out and about this year learning about traveling with an RV. It's a first for us. We've always used hotels for our accommodations when we travel. There is, as in all things, a learning curve. We checked out dealer instructions, took some first-hand advice from experienced RV'ers and used YouTube for other information that we needed to be aware of. We learned some things through real experiences and have come out more aware of pitfalls and, hopefully, have become wiser for it.



Our home on the road

There are so many of our western swing and traditional music festivals that have RV hookups available that we thought we'd give this a try. For us, there's nothing like having our own things around us to make us feel more

comfortable. It's a plus to sleep in one's own bed. Eating healthier by having a kitchen available to prepare our meals is a real advantage. Of course, we do eat out occasionally even with this available.

Traveling takes more time because pulling a trailer slows us down. And, of course, with the added weight, it takes more fuel to pull it down the road. But, the comfort when you get set up is worth it.

We've been using our trailer since February and have taken it out 12 times so far this year, going from one music gathering to the next. Sometimes we stay out for two fests scheduled only a week apart.

Here in the Southwest, our western swing festival season begins in February with the Canton Western Swing Honky Tonk weekend for Valentines Day, then, in March we traveled to La Grange, Texas for the Best Little Cowboy Gathering in Texas four days of great music on two separate stages. In April, it's Bob

Wills Day events in Turkey, Texas. We never know what the weather will be in North Texas so we go prepared for, hot, cold, wind, rain, hail or even tornados – that's just springtime in Texas. We don't let that dampen our enthusiasm. We go every year.

The Texas Western Swing Hall of Fame Show is the first full weekend in April followed by the Bob Wills Day festivities which is always the last Saturday of April. In Turkey you'll see RVs in literally every available space that an RV can be parked. There's only one hotel in tiny Turkey, Texas, the



hotel even has an RV park.

We have a one festival in Navasota, Texas, at the Western Club. RV'ers stay at the county fairgrounds there.

June is a double header we have the West Texas Western Swing Festival in Snyder, Texas, where we just walk to our trailer or they have a shuttle service for fest goers. Just one week later, in Wichita Falls for the Legends of Western Swing Festival, there are self-contained sites on the event center's

parking lot or there are RV parks just a couple of miles from the Wichita Falls Event Center with full hook -ups.

July brings the Western Swing Music Society of the Southwest's Hall of Fame show and inductions, in Lawton, Oklahoma. can stay right on the grounds there in walking distance to the music and The WSSMSS dancing. actually has several different shows in different locals in Texas, Missouri, and Oklahoma that bring several opportunities for RV'ers to participate.

We just came back from

the San Angelo Cowboy Gathering, a two-day, non-stop music event with 8 different bands. The fairgrounds have RV spots with shuttles or in walking distance from all that great music.

Coming up is yet another event in Canton their Halloween party with 6 great bands and that convenient RV parking just outside the doors.

This gives you an idea of how much the RV's can be used at

our Southwest music events. But, you know what is the very best part of this? It's the ability for us to get to know the festival goers a little bit better.

We found pre-event happenings in the different towns that we used to get us out and about. When that wasn't available we created our own gathering right in the RV parks, bringing food of choice, chairs, libations and yes we "threw out the rug, and danced 'til the cows came home."





Looking Back and to the Future: 5th SAN ANGELO

COWBOY GATHERING

Well if I do say so myself, the 5th San Angelo Cowboy Gathering (SACG) on September 8-9, 2017 was a grand success.



The most important thing about our festival I believe is that we are one of very, very few in the nation that gives back to others each and every year. We start our application process for our next year's recipient each October, and then our Board picks one. I can tell you that is a painstaking process! So many deserving entities, but only one can receive a portion of our event proceeds. This year we chose *West Texas Rehabilitation Center of San Angelo*. If you are not familiar with the WTRC, you need to learn more about the terrific work they do serving over 500 patients a day regardless of their financial ability to pay. I am honored to say that we were able to donate \$13,200 to WTRC from the SACG to benefit those patients who have no means to pay for services.

We were able to take in several thousands of dollars on our raffles and Live Auction this year, which helped us donate to WTRC. We had some very generous donors of in kind items and we can't thank them enough for that. Another big donation came from our food concessionaire this year, Brookdale South of San Angelo, an assisted living center, cooked up some down home cooking both days and then turned around and donated \$1800 to us for WTRC and another \$1800 to the Alzheimer's Association. Out of 5 years this is the first time our food host has ever donated back to us. WOW!

The dancefloor was the swinging place to be all weekend. Our great bands and artists kept that floor packed from the time we opened until we shut down at almost midnight both nights. Oh my, if you haven't seen the photos, I would suggest you go to our Facebook page and take a look to see just what I am talking about. Words do not do it justice. We had 2 wonderful award winning Emcees to keep us on schedule, Friday saw Chuck Ramsey from Texas Dancehall Radio at the helm, and Saturday we had Skeebo Norris from "Pickin' On The Oldies" keeping us on time and handling our auction for us

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SEPTEMBER 9TH, 2017 SHOWCASE

For our first showcase since the 2017 Hall of Fame at the Historic Fieldhouse in Enumclaw, we were delighted to have as our host band, a Northwest favorite, Steel Country, with guest artist, Dave Duchane. Incidentally, all three members of Steel Country, and including Dave Duchane, are also all NWWSMS Hall of Fame honorees.

2016 NWWSMS Hall of Fame Inductee, Pat Rowe is the always fabulous, spot-on, Pedal Steel &

Lead Guitar player for Steel Country. When not playing with Steel Country, Pat also plays steel for another of our favorite local Western Swing bands, The Jangles. Pat's versatility and smooth easy style, have also made him a highly sought after local session player. Sometimes when we're lucky, we can even coax him to sing a song or two.

2017 NWWSMS Hall of Fame Inductee, Duane Trueblood, is the Bass Guitar and Piano player, as well as lead vocalist, for Steel Country. Duane's great material choices, beautiful vocals, and musical versatility make him a highly valued member of this band. Last, but certainly not least, 2017 NWWSMS Hall of Fame Inductee, Danny Lyon, is the longtime Drummer and singer for **Steel County**. Danny's background includes a wide variety of musical styles, rock steady tempo's, and solid vocals, which also make him a vital member of this great trio.

Pat, Duane and Danny, all started with this band when it was formerly known as Big Ed and Steel Country. (Big Ed Kaestner was inducted into the NWWSMS Hall of Fame in 2014.) They continued as Steel Country after Big Ed retired and moved to Montana. I know for a fact that Big Ed is so proud of these fellas! Not only are they all wonderfully talented musicians, they are also really good guys, and are a pleasure to share a bandstand with. I am so happy to call them my friends.

To complete the ensemble for our September Showcase; on rhythm guitar and vocals, was 2012 NWWSMS Hall of Fame inductee, Dave Duchane, who when he's not hanging out with Steel Country, is the Bass Player and vocalist for the Southern **Comfort Band.** For obvious reasons, I'm pretty fond of him too. This was going to be a memorable showcase!!

Steel Country took the stage and showered us with variety of our favorite Western Swing and County songs. They kicked it off with Duane's ever popular, "Always Late," and Danny's "There She Goes." Dave followed with "Crazy Arms."

The great dance tunes just kept coming and the floor stayed full for the whole showcase!!






