HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 2017 WESTERN SWING FESTIVAL AND HALL OF FAME CELEBRATION

On this, our first Festival and Hall of Fame event at Enumclaw's Historic Field House, I think that that we can easily call this a successful first run of, hopefully, many more to come.

Every aspect of moving the location of our annual western swing festival posed a new obstacle to overcome. In

years' past, we had been so well treated by the Auburn Eagles and their dedicated volunteers. The benefits of having our annual festival there began with being made to feel so welcome, included catering, a built in bar service, two huge dance floors,

spacious provisions and ending with RV parking for our traveling guests. The bar was set very high for our new event location. We'd like to send a big thank you to the Auburn Eagles for all the past years that our Festival has called the Auburn FOE home.

Not surprisingly, finding the right place to call home for our current and future Festival was a daunting task, but one that Jeanne and Fred Yearian took on with gusto. After several 'almost rights,' they found for us, the beautiful Historic Field House, at the Expo Center in Enumclaw, Washington. In addition, we will be setting up a truss to drape fabric over burlap to help deaden the sound and absorb more of the heat.







From there jams spread to the parking lot as small groups of musicians gathered for their own special tailgate parties. How wonderful is that?


The lesson was realizing that music just happens. It doesn't matter where. Whenever you throw a bunch of likeminded players together, music just happens . . .


